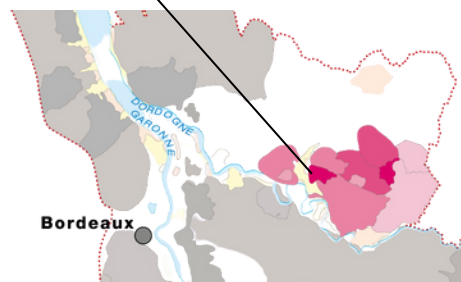


Château Moulinet

While respecting traditional winemaking techniques, it strives for perfection and was one of the pioneers in Bordeaux to experiment with 'whole bunch fermentation'. Tasting Notes:

This wine exudes a delicate aroma, with hints of wild blackberry, cloves, and wild strawberries, accompanied by subtle notes of pepper, licorice, and spices. The palate is rich and juicy, with a balanced elegance, showcasing a mineral frame and a refined texture, displaying ripe blackberry and raspberry flavors with subtle hints of chocolate and caramel. The tannins are lively, and the finish is long with a hint of tonka bean.



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
