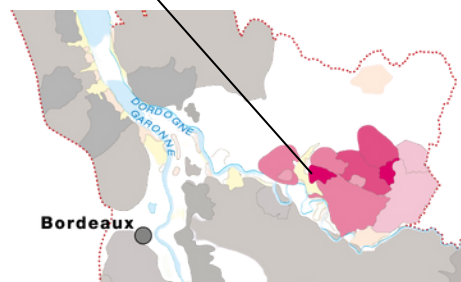


Château Moulinet
